Soils, Soil Amendments, & Soilless Media HORT 1104 - 3 credits
Managing soil quality is the basis of sustainable horticulture. Learn about the chemical, physical, and biological properties of soil and soilless media. Review the options for improving soil quality. Interpret data from soil test reports and other sources of information. Introduction to Pest Management HORT 1217 - 3 credits
Plant health is the focus of this course. You will be introduced to the nature of pests, diseases, and weeds. Learn the basics of integrated pest management (IPM) and how IPM is an important component of sustainable horticulture. Landscape Drafting HORT 1224 - 3 credits
Learn how to produce an excellent landscape design drawing. Employ basic drafting standards to produce functional drawings. Computer assisted design (DynaSCAPE) is an important component of this introductory landscape drafting course. This course is the foundation for landscape design courses.

Greenhouse Practices HORT 1271 - 2 credits
Grow a variety of greenhouse and nursery crops during the busy spring period. Learn commercial production methods for glasshouse vegetables, Easter lilies, bedding plants, cut flower crops, and some nursery plants. See commercial production systems on field trips.

Landscape Construction HORT 2426 - 3 credits
Join us in a fun and practical course constructing a variety of hard landscape features. You'll get an opportunity to build garden walls, patio areas, decks, and delightful ponds to develop beautiful garden landscapes for summer enjoyment. Plant Identification HORT 1155 - 3 credits
Attention gardeners! Cultivate your interest and explore the world of plants from the point of view of a horticulturist. This introductory plant identification course enables you to identify trees, shrubs, vines, groundcovers, perennials, annuals, house plants, and cut flowers. Using the universal scientific language of horticulturists, botanists, and plant aficionados, you will develop your vocabulary and increase your understanding of plants, their history, names, and uses.

Equipment Maintenance HORT 1116 - 2 credits
Where is the air filter? How do you change the oil? What is a 2 stroke engine? Horticulture Equipment Maintenance introduces you to the purpose and importance of basic machinery maintenance on a variety of horticulture equipment.
